To CRIR students

Dear CRIR graduate students, post-doctoral fellows and CRIR members,

Each year at the beginning of May CRIR launches its Student Scholarship Competition. This period coincides with when government funding agencies sent out acceptance / refusal letters.

This year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, funding results may be sent out later than usual; hence this may affect the launch date of the CRIR Student Scholarship Competition.

Your success is important to us. Therefore, we are making the application information available now, in order to give you plenty of time to prepare your documents.

Please stay tuned for forthcoming CRIR emails concerning a launch date and deadline for submissions regarding the CRIR Student Scholarship Competition.

2020 CRIR Student Scholarship Competition

The CRIR Scientific Direction is proud to launch the CRIR Student Scholarship Competition and is offering a limited number of bursaries for research master's (\$8 000) and doctoral (\$15 000) students and post-doctoral fellows (\$20 000). International and Canadian students and fellows members can apply. The primary supervisor must be a CRIR Regular member researcher.

To be eligible for the CRIR Scholarship Competition, you must

- 1. hold student member status at CRIR;
- 2. be supervised (<u>your principal director</u>) by a <u>regular CRIR researcher</u> with bona fide status (as of April 22 2020):
 - your supervisor conducts 100% of his/her research time at CRIR (contact your supervisor to find out his % at CRIR);
- 3. not have been awarded a bursary from a provincial and federal agency (NSERC, CIHR, SSHRC, FQRSC, FRSQ, FQRNT, IRSST) or a foundation (Edith Strauss Foundation or other similar organizations) during the following competition period: September 2020 to April 2021;
- 4. you have a cumulative grade point average greater than 3.5 out of 4.3, 3.0 out of 4.0 or the equivalent during his/her university studies.





Students also eligible

Students who have received a scholarship from their supervisor or a small travel award (Travel Award) from CIHR, REPAR, etc.

In order to be recognized as a student CRIR member, or to update your status (if your level of studies has changed):

 you must complete the <u>online CRIR registration form</u> for your supervisor to approve, before submitting your application to the CRIR Student Scholarship Competition.

Announcement of results

Candidates will receive an email notification of the evaluation committee's decision no later than 60 days after the closing date of the competition.
