2020 CRIR Student Scholarships

Montreal, September 14, 2020 - The CRIR 2020 Student Scholarship Competition was launched on May 5th 2020. The *Centre for Interdisciplinary Research in Rehabilitation of Greater Montreal (CRIR)* Scientific Directors are proud to offer master's (\$8,000), Ph.D. (\$15,000) scholarships, and postdoctoral fellowships (\$20,000), to students supervised by regular CRIR researchers, including international students and those from other Canadian provinces.

New this year! The Scientific Evaluation Committee involved postdoctoral fellows in the evaluation process as a means to enrich skills. Working in dyads with regular researchers, postdoctoral fellows evaluated MSc and Ph.D. applications. In addition, the <u>AGE-WELL</u> Canadian Network of Excellence is collaborating with <u>CRIR</u> to offer a fellowship to an outstanding candidate whose research joins the scientific areas of expertise of both organizations: physical rehabilitation (CRIR), technology and aging (AGE-WELL).

The Scientific Evaluation Committee, composed of CRIR members, including ten regular researchers and eight postdoctoral fellows, carefully analyzed more than 50 applications. The quality of the applications received enabled the committee to recommend the awarding of eleven scholarships.
