The Eva Kehayia Recognition Award – Young researcher is a new award created by the Centre de recherche interdisciplinaire en réadaptation du Montréal métropolitain (CRIR) in honour of Eva Kehayia, CRIR Scientific Co-Director from 2000-2020. During her years as director, she distinguished herself by her human qualities, her outstanding commitment to the CRIR and its members, her invaluable leadership and her ability to act as a mentor to young researchers and students.

This is why a prize will be awarded to a young CRIR researcher who has made a special contribution to the development of adaptation and rehabilitation research and to the CRIR's mission during the first seven years of his or her career.

## **Objectives**

- To recognize the contribution of young researchers to the development and updating of the CRIR's research mission;
- To promote research in adaptation and rehabilitation.

### Award

- A two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) prize
- The recipient will have the opportunity to present his or her research results at a CRIR event (lunch conference, assembly, scientific day, etc.).

# Eligibility criteria

To be eligible, the candidate must be a regular or emerging member of the CRIR and must have obtained his or her first academic or institutional research position within the last 7 years (as of January 1, 2021).

### **Selection Committee**

A selection committee will have the mandate to receive and evaluate the applications. This committee will be composed of four or five members who will make a recommendation to the Research Orientation Committee:

- Scientific Director of the CRIR (chair of the selection committee);
- Eva Keyahia;
- Two regular members (researchers), one from each axis;
- One coordinating member for clinical research or intervention

**Note:** a person who has supported a nomination cannot be a member of the selection committee.

### **Evaluation criteria**

The committee will evaluate the applications submitted according to four criteria. Only the information submitted will be considered in the evaluation of the applications:

Leadership. Leadership and commitment to the development of rehabilitation research (quality
of the research program, implementation of innovative strategies and means, awards and
mentions received, invitations as a speaker, etc.);





- 2. **Impact**. The repercussions and influence of research work related to the CRIR's mission (changes induced in clinical practices, impact on the scientific community in adaptation-rehabilitation, etc.);
- 3. **Commitment to the CRIR.** (Participation in site activities, evaluation activities, advice, committees, contributions aiming to increase CRIR's visibility, etc.);
- 4. **Mentoring**. Contribution to mentoring and training of the next generation (training of students, support for graduate students, communications by these individuals, prizes won by these individuals, etc.).

### Presentation of the application

- The application package includes in one PDF:
  - A presentation letter (maximum 2 pages) demonstrating that the nomination meets the evaluation criteria;
  - o a 150-250 words summary which will be used to announce the candidacy;
  - o an updated resume (acceptable formats: CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC, FRQS, FRQN or FRQSC).
- The nomination must be supported by two members of the CRIR. These two members must certify by e-mail that they have read and approved the application.
- The nominations must be submitted to the following e-mail address: <u>administration.crir@ssss.gouv.qc.ca</u>, no later than 4 p.m. on April 26, 2021.

In order to receive his or her award, the recipient will have to provide the following at a later date:

- A photograph;
- Clerical information.

N.B. The photo of the winning entry and the summary will be published on the CRIR website.
